Foundation of SEML, Inc.

In 1985, a group of citizens became aware of plans to build a water treatment facility in the vicinity of Boat Club Road and Lechner Drive. SEML was formed and petitioned the Texas Water Commission to declare a moratorium on new permits for sewage disposal into the lake. The moratorium was granted and is now controlled by TCEQ.
